

# Barton to Barrow Haven

From Barton railway station, turn right and head north along Waterside Road. Turn right at Malkiln Road and, taking care of vehicles, follow signs to the Ropewalk through the supermarket car park. The Ropewalk, the longest single story, brick built Grade II listed building in the UK, has good wheelchair access and outstanding facilities including an art gallery, museum, cafe, sculpture park and live music venue.



Follow the road along the side of the Ropewalk and at the end follow the public footpath sign onto the Heritage Trail.



Passing Barton Haven dock on the left with the Humber Bridge in the background and the Waters' Edge Country Park, Visitors Centre and Tourist Information on the right.



Continue along the bank of the Humber estuary passing many waterways including the sailing club and water skiing centre. This is an excellent area for bird watching.



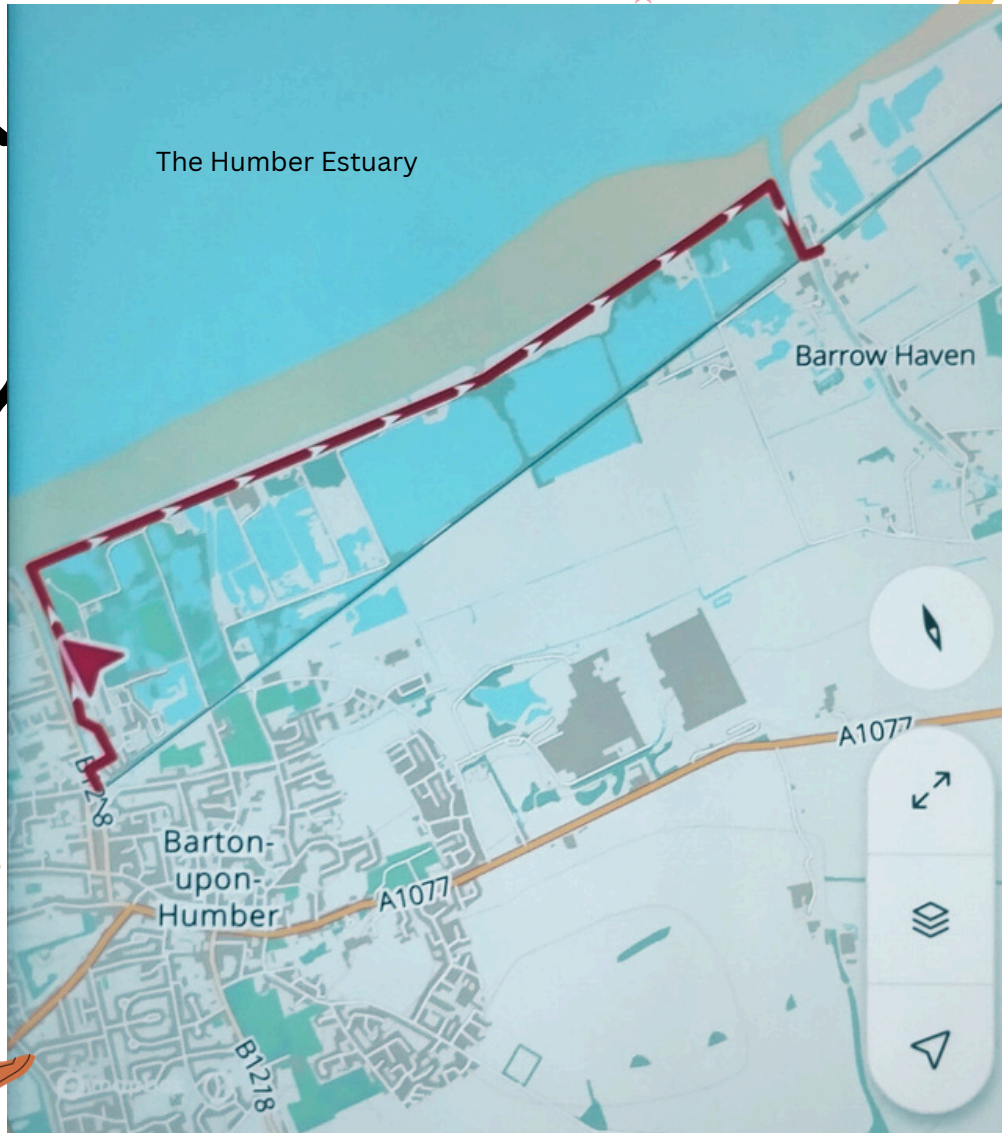
At Barrow Beck the path turns southwards and in less than 10 minutes you arrive at Barrow Haven railway station.
