

## Thornton Abbey to Ulceby



From platform 1 at Thornton Abbey railway station take the white exit gate and head across the field. You can see the majestic Thornton Abbey in the distance up ahead.



On exiting the field turn right onto Carr Lane. You can see Thornton Abbey and Gatehouse from here - the largest ornate gatehouse in England.



Stay on Carr lane for two miles, passing Thornton Abbey Maze on the right, a wonderful stopping off point to see lambing in the spring! Whilst this is a very quiet country road, there could be vehicles, so please take extra care.



Continue along the lane and cross Bystaple Lane level crossing, following the road heading left.

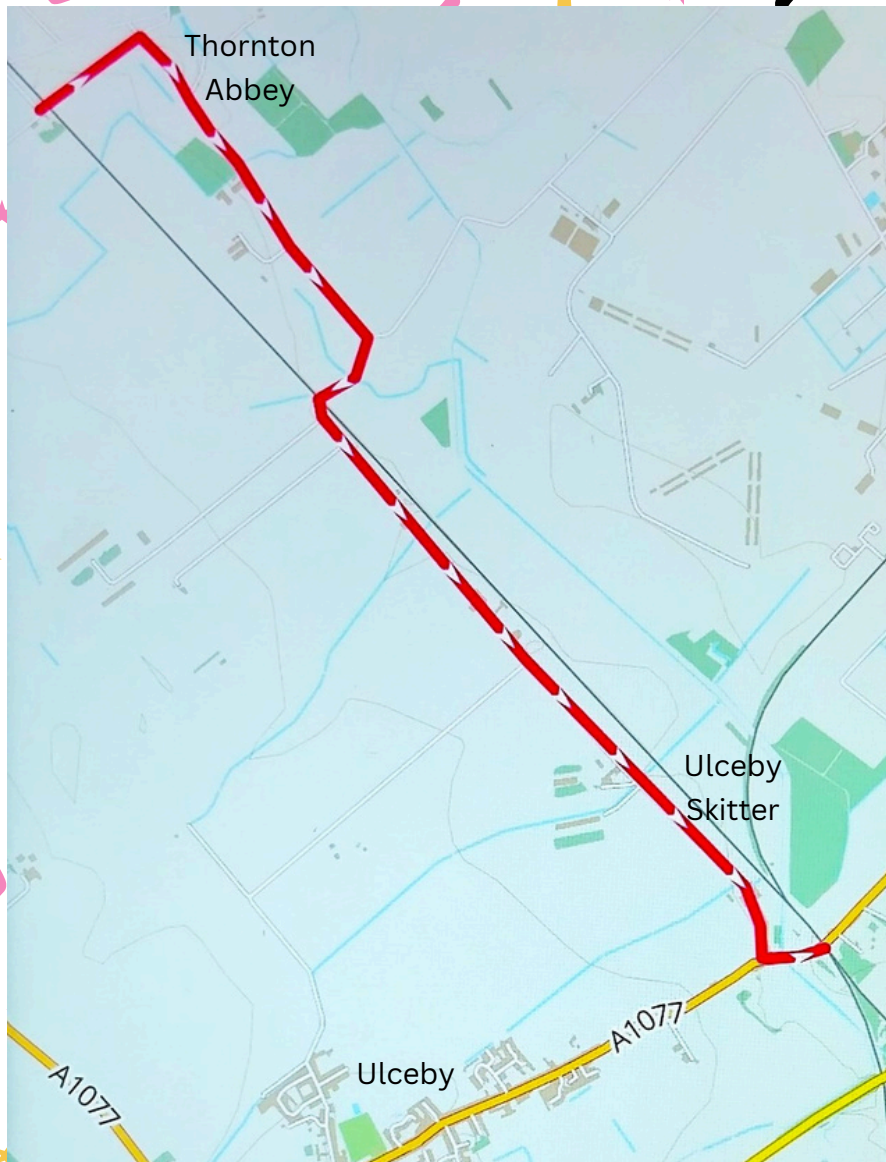


You are on this peaceful country lane, passing farms and open fields until you reach Ulceby Skitter. At the end of Carr Lane turn left onto Station Road and shortly you arrive at Ulceby Railway Station.
